

REFERENCE: ICC-ASP/5/IS/27

The Secretariat of the Assembly of States Parties presents its compliments to the Permanent Mission ofto the United Nations and with reference to its note verbale ICC-ASP/S/5/04 of 6 February 2006, has the honour to recall that States not having observer status in the Assembly may nonetheless be invited to be present in the forthcoming session. Rule 94 of the Rules of Procedure of the Assembly of States Parties reads as follows:

"Rule 94 States not having observer status

At the beginning of each session of the Assembly, the President may, subject to the approval of the Assembly, invite a given State which is not a party and does not have observer status to designate a representative to be present during the work of the Assembly. A representative who is so designated may be authorized by the Assembly to make a statement."

The Secretariat therefore requests that the name of the corresponding representative for the fifth session of the Assembly, to be held in The Hague, The Netherlands, from 23 November to 1 December 2006, be submitted along with the respective name for the resumed fifth session, to be held in New York on 29-31 January 2007. This would facilitate the work of the Assembly.

The Secretariat of the Assembly of States Parties notes that if a representative of a State at the resumed fifth session in New York is different from a representative to the fifth session in The Hague, then a separate communication would be required for the resumed fifth session.

As of 19 January 2007, all communications for the resumed fifth session should no longer be sent to The Hague, but delivered directly to the Secretariat of the Assembly at the beginning of the resumed fifth session in New York.

The Secretariat of the Assembly of States Parties requests that the enclosed registration form be submitted as soon as possible, so as to expedite the issuance of conference badges for the fifth session in The Hague and the compilation of the List of Participants of both the fifth session and the resumed fifth session.

Delegates not holding a valid United Nations ground pass will have to liaise through their Missions in New York. A letter signed by the Head of Chancery or Administrative Officer containing the names of participants and the completed SG 6 forms, must be sent to the Chief of Protocol of the United Nations. Once the forms have been authorized by Protocol, permanent missions are requested to deliver them to delegates, for processing at the pass and ID office.
