The Secretariat of the Assembly of States Parties presents its compliments to States Parties and, on behalf of the President of the Assembly, has the honour to refer to its note verbale ICC-ASP/13/SP/06, dated 18 February 2014, and resolution ICC-ASP/3/Res.6 on the procedure for the nomination and election of judges of the International Criminal Court, adopted by the Assembly of States Parties on 10 September 2004. Under the terms of paragraph 10 of the aforementioned resolution, the President wishes to inform States Parties that, as at 8 June 2014, the status of nominations for the election of six judges was as follows:
