Situation in the Democratic Republic of the Congo

In this situation, four cases have been brought before the relevant Chambers: *The Prosecutor v. Thomas Lubanga Dyilo*; *The Prosecutor v. Bosco Ntaganda*; *The Prosecutor v. Germain Katanga and Mathieu Ngudjolo Chui*; and *The Prosecutor v. Callixte Mbarushimana*. The accused Thomas Lubanga Dyilo, Germain Katanga, Mathieu Ngudjolo Chui and Callixte Mbarushimana are currently in the custody of the ICC. The suspect Bosco Ntaganda remains at large. The trial in the case *The Prosecutor v. Thomas Lubanga Dyilo* started on 26 January 2009. The trial in the case of *The Prosecutor v. Germain Katanga and Mathieu Ngudjolo Chui* started on 24 November 2009. The confirmation of charges hearing in the case *The Prosecutor v. Callixte Mbarushimana* is scheduled to start on 4 July 2011.

In partnership with the local NGO, The Youth Council of Kinshasa, an interactive outreach session was held with more than 60 university students. They were provided with general information on the Court, as

well as details on the latest judicial developments. Audio-visual summaries of the most recent proceedings in the Jean-Pierre Bemba and Callixte Mbarushimana cases were screened, followed by a question and answer session.

At the end of the session, an evaluation survey was conducted in order to establish the students' level of understanding about the Court and the cases that had been discussed. They suggested that the Outreach Team hold more such sessions, and expressed their enthusiasm for the audio-visual summaries of the proceedings.
