The exhibition took place in the ICC Field Office in Kampala, and it was attended by Senior Court Officials, States Parties delegates, the diplomatic community, local and international NGOs, the media and representatives of government ministries. As for the launch of female campaign event, PIDS staff in cooperation with the Uganda Law Society and FIDA facilitated the attendance over seventy Uganda female. PIDS also supported OPCD in publicising the moot court as well as audio-visual coverage of the event.</p>
