



## Public Information and Outreach in the Central African Republic Calendar of Activities – February 2011

### Overall objectives:

- Ensure information about the Jean-Pierre Bemba Gombo is widely disseminated amongst the general public, predefined target groups and communities affected;
- Facilitate contact between the legal teams representing victims in the case of *The Prosecutor v. Jean-Pierre Bemba Gombo* and the communities affected;
- Inform the general public about current events related to the International Criminal Court.
