## Public Information and Outreach in Sudan Calendar of Activities – July 2011

**Overall Objectives:** To increase understanding of the International Criminal Court, its mandate and activities in connection with the situation in Darfur amongst diverse constituencies by:

- Consulting NGOs, Media and legal communities concerned with the crisis in Darfur, in Europe and elsewhere, to prepare for outreach activities aiming to raise awareness about the International Criminal Court among the affected communities, and to provide a greater understanding of the Court's mandate and work.
- Developing and coordinating outreach activities aiming at raising awareness about the Court's mandate and activities inside the refugee camps in eastern Chad.
- Conducting outreach activities targeting affected communities living in exile.
- Developing Social Media projects aiming to reach broader audience through internet.

			simplified Arabic. The programme	
			is divided to short episodes, each	
			of three-minute duration, to	
			include only one question and one	
			answer, in order to enable a daily	
			and repeated broadcasting of	
			these episodes. "Ask the Court"	
			aims to address the concerns and	
			expectations expressed by the	
			Darfurian refugees in eastern	
			Chad, and to encounter any
