# ICC Weekly Update

## 19 April 2010 #30

### Situation in the Democratic Republic of the Congo

In this situation, three cases are being heard before the relevant Chambers: *The Prosecutor v. Thomas Lubanga Dyilo*; *The Prosecutor v. Bosco Ntaganda*; and *The Prosecutor v. Germain Katanga and Mathieu Ngudjolo Chui*. The accused Thomas Lubanga Dyilo, Germain Katanga and Mathieu Ngudjolo Chui are currently in the custody of the ICC. The suspect Bosco Ntaganda remains at large. The trial in the case *The Prosecutor v. Thomas Lubanga Dyilo* started on 26 January, 2009. The trial in the case of *The Prosecutor v. Germain Katanga and Mathieu Ngudjolo Chui* started on 24 November, 2009.

#### ICC Registrar discussed shared challenges with registrars of final/appellate, regional and international Courts

The Registrar of the International Criminal Court (ICC), Ms Silvana Arbia, attended a 'Meeting of registrars of final/appellate, regional and international Courts'. The meeting, organised by the Commonwealth Secretariat, was hosted by the Supreme Court of Canada. It took place in Ottawa, Canada, from 14 to 16 April, 2010.

The event was intended to serve as a forum to discuss institutional and operational challenges affecting registrars, and to exchange best practices. During the meeting, Ms Arbia addressed aspects of the ICC Registrar's duties in "servicing the Court" as established under article 43(1) of the Rome Statute, in support of all its organs. She also addressed specific challenges in various fields such as the legal aid programme, family visits for detainees, and the protection and support afforded to victims and witnesses.
