## Public Information and Outreach for Darfur Calendar of Activities – April 2012

**Overall Objectives:** To increase understanding of the International Criminal Court (ICC), its mandate and activities in connection with the situation in Darfur amongst diverse constituencies by:

- Holding face-to-face outreach meetings with the groups affected by the crimes committed in relation to the situation in Darfur.
- Developing and coordinating outreach projects aiming at raising awareness about the Court's mandate and work among the groups affected by the crimes committed in relation to the situation in Darfur.
- Consulting and cooperating with NGOs, Media and legal communities concerned with the
  crisis in Darfur to develop and carry outreach activities aiming to raise awareness about, and
  foster understanding of the ICC and the International Criminal Justice among the affected
  communities, in Africa and elsewhere.

			simplified Arabic. The programme	
			is divided to short episodes, each	
			of 2-3 minutes duration to include	
			only one question and one answer	
			in order to enable a daily and	
			repeated broadcasting of these
