The Secretariat of the Assembly of States Parties presents its compliments to Observer States, and with reference to its note verbale ICC-ASP/19/S/02 of 13 January 2020, has the honour to request that the names of designated representatives of Observer States, and of alternates and advisers who accompany them, for the nineteenth session of the Assembly to be held in New York from 7 to 17 December 2020, be submitted well in advance of the session. This would facilitate the work of the Assembly.

The communication should, preferably, contain the name of the representative of the Observer State, as well as the names of the alternates and advisers for the nineteenth session.

Copies may also be sent via fax to +31-70-515-8376 or via e-mail to asp@icc-cpi.int. As of 7 December 2017, all communications for the nineteenth session should be delivered directly to the Secretariat of the Assembly at the beginning of the session in New York.

The Secretariat of the Assembly of States Parties recalls that a United Nations grounds pass is required for access to United Nations premises during the nineteenth session. Delegates not holding a valid United Nations ground pass are advised to liaise through their permanent missions in New York. A letter stamped and signed by the Head of Chancery or Administrative Officer containing the names of the official representatives of the States must be sent to the Chief of Protocol of the United Nations, followed by online application of United Nations grounds pass via the “eRegistration” system available at the eDelegate Portal (<http://delegate.in.int>), not later than 27 November 2020. Once the online applications have been approved by the Protocol Office, approval emails for each delegate will be sent to the permanent missions. Please be reminded that hard copies of the approval emails must be presented to the United Nations Pass and ID Office for issuance of the grounds passes.
