

## Reference: ICC-ASP/22/SP/29

The Secretariat of the Assembly of States Parties presents its compliments to States Parties and, on behalf of the President of the Assembly, has the honour to refer to its notes verbales ICC-ASP/22/SP/01 and ICC-ASP/22/SP/12, dated 19 December 2022 and 29 March 2023, and resolution ICC-ASP/3/Res.6 on the procedure for the nomination and election of judges of the International Criminal Court, as amended by resolutions ICC-ASP/18/Res.4 and ICC-ASP/21/Res.2.

The Secretariat wishes to inform States Parties that, at the close of the extended nomination period, on 9 April 2023, the status of nominations was as follows:

As indicated in the table above, not all minimum requirements for the nomination of judges have been met. Under the terms of paragraph 11 of resolution ICC-ASP/3/Res.6, the nomination period for the election of judges has therefore been further extended until <u>Sunday</u>, 23 April 2023. States Parties are requested to transmit nominations by courier or via e-mail to <u>asp@icc-cpi.int</u>, to be received by the Secretariat of the Assembly <u>before midnight (Central European time) on 23 April 2023</u>. If feasible, the Secretariat would appreciate receiving digital versions, preferably the Word versions, of the nominations.
