Excellency,

I have the honour to refer to the upcoming **informal inter-sessional meeting on the Crime of Aggression**, hosted by the Liechtenstein Institute on Self-Determination (Woodrow Wilson School, Princeton University) from **8 to 10 June 2009**. The meeting will take place in the same format as previous inter-sessional meetings of the Special Working Group on the Crime of Aggression (SWGCA) and thus be open to participation by all States, as well as by some representatives nominated by the NGO Coalition for the International Criminal Court. The meeting will follow-up on the outcome of the final meeting of the SWGCA in February 2009, under the chairmanship of **H.R.H. Prince Zeid Ra'ad Zeid Al-Hussein** (Jordan).

This year, the meeting will take place in **New York City** at the **Princeton Club, 15 West 43rd Street** (www.princetonclub.com). Given the proximity to UN Headquarters, accommodation will be the responsibility of participants and will not be provided by the organizers. The meeting will end on Wednesday, 10 June 2009, at 1 p.m.

I would be most grateful if your Mission could informally notify the organizers at the earliest convenience whether your country will be represented at that meeting. Due to space limitations at the new venue, and in order to allow for universal participation, no more than **two nominations per delegation** should be forwarded by 30 April 2009 via e-mail to Ms. Barbara Stefan, intersessional2009@gmail.com. Registration forms should preferably be filled out electronically and can be requested at the same email address, together with any logistical inquiries.

I am confident that your country's delegation will contribute to another successful inter-sessional, marked by the "spirit of Princeton" – this time in New York City itself.
