The Secretariat of the Assembly of States Parties presents its compliments to States Parties and, on behalf of the President of the Assembly, has the honour to refer to its notes ICC-ASP/7/S/19, ICC-ASP/7/S/44 and ICC-ASP/7/S/66, dated 15 April, 14 October and 28 October 2008, respectively, as well as to resolution ICC-ASP/3/Res.6 on the procedure for the nomination and election of judges of the International Criminal Court, adopted by the Assembly of States Parties on 10 September 2004. Under the terms of paragraph 11 of the aforementioned resolution, the Secretariat wishes to inform States Parties that, as at 10 November 2008, the status of nominations for the election was as follows:

As indicated in the table above, not all minimum requirements for the nomination of judges have been met. Under the terms of paragraph 11 of the resolution, the nomination period for the judges has been extended a third time, until Monday, 24 November 2008. States are requested to transmit nominations by courier or, preferably, via fax (+31-70-515-8376) to be received by the Secretariat of the Assembly before midnight (Central European time) on 24 November 2008.
