December 21<sup>st</sup>, 2005  
Agenda and Decisions

1. **Secondment of ICC Personnel**

The Bureau was informed of the possible designation of Deputy Prosecutor Serge Brammertz as Commissioner of the United Nations Independent Investigation Commission [UNIIC] and of the administrative leave of absence procedure that was being envisaged by the Office of the Prosecutor. The Bureau concurred that the decision to grant a leave of absence fell within the competences of the Prosecutor.
2. **Preparations for Resumed Session**
  - a) **Interim Premises**

The issue was raised in the Bureau for information and consultation purposes only. No decisions were taken.
  - b) **LDC Trust Fund (para.38 of ICC/ASP/4/Res.4)**

Pursuant to ICC-ASP/4/Res.4 paragraph 38, and taking into consideration that no contributions had yet been specifically earmarked for developing countries, the Bureau decided that the provisional change to the terms of the trust fund (established by ICC-ASP/2/Res.6 paragraph 1) would not apply to the resumed 4<sup>th</sup> session of the ASP.
3. **Vacancies in Subsidiary Bodies (ICC/ASP/4/Res.5 and Res.6)**

The Bureau decided that informal consultations would be conducted with the Group of Latin American and Caribbean States (GRULAC), for the vacancy in the Board of Directors of the Victims Trust Fund, and with the Group of Eastern European States (GEE), for the vacancy in the Committee on Budget and Finance, with the purpose of identifying possible candidates. Estonia volunteered to conduct informal consultations within the GEE.
4. **Other Matters**
