- All modelled on CARIN.




Asset Recovery Inter-Agency Network of Southern Africa (ARINSA)

- Established in 2009;
- Currently 11 member countries, covering Southern and Eastern Africa;
- Since inception dedicated Asset
 Forfeiture Adviser running network;
- Secretariat Asset Forfeiture Unit,
 National Prosecuting Authority of South Africa.

ARINSA Progress 2016

355 cases of Confiscated Assets

237 cases
Where
funds are
seized

178 vehicles worth over \$2m seized

94 cases of Asset Forfeiture \$5,6m in Gold and other assets

\$23m worth of assets seized



Asset Recovery Inter-Agency Network of West Africa (ARINWA)

- Established in 2014;
- Currently 15 member countries;
- AML/CFT Adviser based in Dakar, Senegal assisting network;
- Secretariat Côte d'Ivoire;
- In 2016 USD 8.4 million seized and USD
 8.6 million of crime proceeds recovered.



UNODC Financial Investigations Work

- FATF Recommendation 30 Parallel financial investigations.
 - Wildlife typology project ESAAMLG.
- Train-the-Trainer Financial Investigations.
 - Cote d'Ivoire 2nd country benefited from programme;
 - Identified 12 national trainers from the Police,
 Gendarmerie, Financial Intelligence Unit (CENTIF), and Customs;
 - Since 2015, replicated the training for almost 900 practitioners.



UNODC & ICC Collaboration

- Some ARINWA countries, in particular Senegal, suggested ICC <u>should rely on the existing regional</u> <u>framework</u>, such as ARINWA for operational cooperation.
- Where ICC requests several States parties to <u>simultaneously execute freezing orders</u>, should <u>coordinate this with ARINWA</u> to optimize chances of success of the request.
- ARINWA can <u>spontaneously share</u> information on criminal assets or <u>assist country in implementing</u> ICC freezing orders.
