### **Implementing legislation questionnaire for States Parties**

1. Has your Government adopted any national legislation implementing the Rome Statute ("the Statute")? <u>Yes. The International Criminal Court Act 2001 applies in</u> <u>England, Wales and Northern Ireland. The International Criminal Court</u> (Scotland) Act 2001 applies in Scotland. And the International Criminal Court Act (Overseas Territories) Orders 2009 and 2010 apply in overseas territories.

- 2. What legislative efforts, if any, has your Government taken to implement the provisions of the Statute into national law?
- 3. What obstacles, if any, has your Government faced in its efforts to implement the provisions of the Statute?
- 4. What form of assistance would benefit your Government's efforts to implement the Statute?

#### IF YES Part B

- 5. In implementing the Statute, did your Government draft special implementing legislation or did it incorporate the articles or substantive provisions of the Statute into pre-existing law? <u>Special implementing legislation was drafted.</u>
- 6. Does the implementing legislation incorporate the substantive crimes through reference to the Statute or by incorporating the crimes in the legislation itself? <u>The substantive crimes are incorporated into the legislation itself.</u>
- 7. Does the implementing legislation fully incorporate all modes of cooperation under Part 9 of the Statute? <u>Yes</u>.
- 8. Does the implementing legislation designate a channel of communication with the Court? Yes; it is the Secretary of State for Foreign & Commonwealth Affairs.
