20th anniversary of the adoption of the Rome Statute

17 July 2018 marks the twentieth anniversary of the adoption of the Rome Statute, the founding treaty of the International Criminal Court. States Parties play a crucial role in the support of the Rome Statute; therefore, the ICC has produced the following tools that are at the disposal of the States Parties to use as support for the various campaigns or as inspiration for their national activities:

- Printing and displaying the exhibition "Trauma, healing and hope" in the respective countries;
- Using the campaign logo for the national events related to the 20th anniversary of the Rome Statute;
