

The Secretariat of the Assembly of States Parties presents its compliments to the Permanent Mission of ... to the United Nations and, on behalf of the President of the Assembly, has the honour to refer to resolution ICC-ASP/3/Res.6 on the procedure for the nomination and election of judges of the International Criminal Court, adopted by the Assembly of States Parties on 10 September 2004. Under the terms of paragraph 10 thereof, the President wishes to inform States Parties that, as of 29 August 2005, the status of nominations for the six seats of judges is as follows:
